







Europe's Security Challenges - 2016



NATO's mission is to safeguard the freedom and security of its members through political and military means

- **POLITICAL** NATO promotes democratic values and encourages consultation and cooperation on defence and security issues to build trust and, in the long run, prevent conflict.
- **MILITARY** NATO is committed to the peaceful resolution of disputes. If diplomatic efforts fail, it has the military capacity needed to undertake crisis-management operations. These are carried out under Article 5 of the Washington Treaty NATO's founding treaty or under a UN mandate, alone or in cooperation with other countries and international organizations.



Hybrid warfare is a military strategy that blends conventional warfare, irregular warfare and cyber warfare. By combining kinetic (combat) operations with subversive efforts, the aggressor intends to **avoid attribution or retribution**.

NATO Force Integration Units (NFIU) and Baltic NATO Centres of Excellence (COE)





- 40 personnel from 14 NATO nations serve in NFIU Lithuania
- Different specialists from different services with broad experiences contributing to unified task
- It is organized as a general military Headquarters with logistics, operations, intelligence, command, and signals branches
